

WHAT IS THIS GUIDEBOOK?



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

YOU LIVE IN A

Thousands of people from different backgrounds and routines share the metropolitan space daily, sharing common troubles and opportunities. The daily life bind the metropolitan citizens to many paths every day, be it from home to work, be it to have access to leisure, retail, health services, education and so on among many others. Many of these paths pass through more than one city, increasing the citizen's feeling of belonging beyond its own hometown – this is the meaning of **metropolitan citizenship**.

34 CITIES AND ONE REALITY


The metropolitan regions are shaped by many cities that share services, equipment, opportunities but also problems that go beyond the municipalities' borders, affecting neighbor localities or even a whole region. Therefore, the search for local level solutions shows itself insufficient. The metropolitan land use and occupation planning is one of the main subjects to require shared common solutions. The Macrozoning is one of the tools to stand up to this among many other challenges, in the aim of a more fair and sustainable territorial organization.

DID YOU KNOW?

Established in 1973, the Metropolitan Region of Belo Horizonte was formerly composed by 14 municipalities and 1.7 million inhabitants. Today it is Brazil's third largest urban agglomeration and contains approximately 5 million inhabitants in its 34 municipalities.

> The Metropolitan Plan of Integrated Development, prepared between 2009 and 2010 to be a reference in metropolitan planning to the 34 cities in the next decades, has the Macrozoning as one of its extensions of participative metropolitan planning started by the PDDI-RMBH.

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What is MACROZONING

Organizing the territory has always been a main subject in any society. Since remote times populations used to separate areas for hunting, planting, fun and housing.

The Macrozoning is the instrument that will allow us to settle the areas of interest in the metropolitan

territory.

It shall establish the main directives for land use and occupation through parameters that can be put into laws, guaranteeing a democratic access to the Metropolitan Region of BH.

DID YOU KNOW?

Urban Planning

The territorial zoning is an urban planning tool, which divides the territory into specific land use and occupation areas. These rules set how much and how can someone build in each one of these areas, and what activities are allowed or forbidden in that place. The zoning therefore sets the boundaries to the individual interests, aiming the collective welfare, and the core objectives such as to control the urban growth and densification, to protect areas of cultural and environmental interest that are either fragile or inadequate to occupation, to stimulate collective and economic inclusive activities for the population and to reduce conflicts between uses and activities.



MACRO ZONING

IN DETAILS

- The formulation of the Macrozoning will take into consideration some directives within the Metropolitan Plan (PDDI/2011) such as:
- To establish a web of centralities;
- To lead the occupation of the urban expansion,
- To intensify the use of urbanized and idle areas,
- To enhance the distribution of activities within the territory, reducing unnecessary displacement;
- To assure the water supply in RMBH as a whole to future generations;
- T o promote ecological corridors, to keep biodiversity and to preserve water springs;
- To ensure a collective built legal framework.

ZIMs

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One of the Macrozoning objectives is the definition of the **Zones of Metropolitan** Interest – ZIMs, in other words, bounded territories in which the metropolitan interest prevails over the local.

The ZIMs can be different among themselves, to incorporate distinguished urban parameters according to each metropolitan interest.

The Macrozoning shall also points out the **Areas of Metropolitan Interest – AIMs**, understood as portions of the territory focused on the fulfillment of metropolitan politics agreed during the construction of the Macrozoning.





CENTRALITIES

The meaning of outskirts can be defined as:

"region far from the urban center, with low or none structure and urban services, where lives the low income population"

Another aim of the Macrozoning is to over the territory. Centrality is hereinbreak with this concept of outskirts by comprehended as an accessible urban strengthening a web of centralities and going area with a diversified concentration of forward from a **MONOCENTERED** – with only jobs, retail, public and private services, one great centrality – to a **POLYCENTERED** housing and leisure and culture equipment. structure – with many centralities sprawled



MACROZONING

The elaboration of the Macrozoning is a process built together with the civil society, government and university, guided on the construction of a meaning of **metropolitan citizenship**.

It is about establish a continuous process of discussion, cooperation and integration of knowledge sharing a mutual learning process for planners and civil society.

The organization of the territory through the Macrozoning will certainly contribute to a more balanced communitarian life; however, this tool by itself is not capable of solving all the problems in the metropolitan region. Hence, the Macrozoning process of construction needs to go beyond itself, contributing to create a metropolitan identity promoting the relations of the population with its territories.



LUMEs

The Places of Metropolitan Urbanity - LUMEs - are locations whose management must be shared by political agents, universities, technicians, civil society, managers and workers, communitarian and class associations, councils and other social groups, with the common aim to enhance and widen the established web during the discussions about the Macrozoning. The knowledge and information produced during the process must be widely spread through the LUMEs, using an accessible language to stimulate the autonomy of the citizens, and, at the same time, the feeling of belonging to the metropolis - the metropolitan citizenship.

Because of that, we here emphasize once more our invitation: attend the workshops and seminars and bring your contributions to the project!


On February/March will happen the first row of workshops with the presence of the 5 micro-regions:

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
